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2 EDITORIAL BY GUILLAUME PIENS Fair director

A New start for Art Paris Art Fair A showcase for the arts in the spring

Under the leadership of a new team and renamed "ART PARIS ART FAIR" the 2012 edition is marked by a complete transformation of the fair. A selection of 120 galleries from 16 countries, 56% of which are first time participants, are coming together under the majestic glass roof of the Grand Palais to present a wide panorama of international modern and contemporary art.

The spotlight is on the scenes of Europe at this year's Art Paris Art Fair: an exploration of the regions focusing on singular emerging local prospects from Marseille to Helsinki, Cologne to Lisbon, Zagreb to Vienna and Budapest. The European theme is a good opportunity to (re)visit the major trends of the 20th Century which continue to influence today's artists: geometrical abstraction from the post-war period, new realism, cinetism and research into optical phenomena from the 1960s, Viennese actionism from the 1970s, painting that made a come-back in the 1980s...

While Art Paris Arts Fair embraces Europe in the wider sense – as far as the Balkans - it also seeks to showcase international art that is emerging from Asia, Africa, the Middle East and Latin America.

Open to all forms of artistic expression, Art Paris Art Fair 2012 is launching a new section highlighting contemporary design called "Limited Edition" as well as a space entitled "Large Format" dedicated to showing monumental pieces inside the Grand Palais.

The intention of the fair is also to contribute to the advancement of contemporary art as well as confirming Paris' place as a great cultural capital in the world. In line with this ambition, the fair is introducing a series of conferences as well a programme of visits under the headline "Springtime in Paris" targeting collectors and institutions. The objective is to provide guests with privileged access to the wealth of artistic and cultural events taking place in the City of Lights this spring.

We wish to extend our warmest thanks to all our supporters, members of selection committee, gallery owners, Parisian institutions and partners who have helped breathe new life into Art Paris Art Fair in 2012. Thanks to all, the fair has become the not-to-be missed Springtime art event in the heart of Europe.

3 | ART PARIS ART FAIR 2012 GENERAL PRESENTATION

A new start for Art Paris Art Fair, the springtime fair for modern and contemporary art in Paris.

Held from 29th March to 1st April 2012, Art Paris Art Fair is the springtime event for modern and contemporary art in France that brings together 120 galleries from 16 countries under the majestic glass roof of the Grand Palais.

Under a new leadership, the fair has been renamed ART PARIS ART FAIR and has undergone a complete transformation. This year sees 56% of newcomers to the fair, with some 40% of participating galleries from abroad. Also new is a VIP programme of visits entitled "Springtime in Paris," a series of talks, a new section dedicated to cutting edge contemporary design called "Limited Edition." Another novelty is "Large Format", a project presenting monumental works within the fair itself.

A high quality European fair with a focus on the international art scene

As an event aimed at the general public, Art Paris Art Fair is working to promote what is a wide variety of art scenes from around Europe - from Marseille to Helsinki and from Lisbon to Vienna. The objective is to discover and highlight some of the more singular local scenes such as that of Hungary which is exceptionally well represented this year with seven modern and contemporary galleries.

Particular attention is also paid to the present trend which sees contemporary artists questioning the heritage of European modernism

and reassessing recent historical movements. Art Paris Art Fair also gives pride of place to modern work: a surrealist cabinet at Levy Gallery (Berlin), Viennese actionism at Konzett (Vienna) and Zimmerman Kratochwill (Graz). Also on show are examples of cinetism and research into optical phenomena at Lélia Mordoch (Paris) and Meyer Zafra as well as geometrical abstraction at Anne Lahumière (Paris) and Müller and Gimpel (Paris/London). Lyrical abstraction enthusiasts will find much to see at the French galleries Berthet Aittouarès (Paris) and Jacques Elbaz (Paris).

Contemporary work also has its place, in particular with a number of leading galleries that are taking part in Art Paris Art Fair for the first time, notably Filles du Calvaire (Paris), Laurent Godin (Paris), Bertrand Grimont (Paris), l'Espace Beaumont (Luxemburg) which is unveiling a monumental work entitled « Monument » from the Atelier Van Lieshout, Germany's Bourouina, Stefan Roepke and Anna Klinkammer....

Limited Edition: a section that aims to explore the relationship between art and contemporary design

Open to all forms of artistic expression, Art Paris Art Fair 2012 is launching a new section showcasing design. Curated by expert Bénédicte Colpin, this "Limited Edition" section brings together a selection of six cutting edge galleries such as Patrick Brillet Fine Art, Pierre Alain Challier, Domeau & Pérès, Galerie Matignon, Slott Galerie and White Moon Gallery who will show exclusive pieces made by top contemporary designers.

Les Echos Série limitée magazine is supporting this initiative and is launching the «Prototype Série limitée Prize» to reward a piece of work that is emblematic of a unique, specific skill.

Springtime in Paris : a tour of the best of what's on in town

Art Paris Art Fair has organised a programme of visits for its invited VIP guests entitled "Springtime in Paris" which will offer private access to the major events on the arts scene this spring. This includes exhibitions such as "Neon: who's afraid of red, yellow and blue" at La Maison Rouge, "Joel-Peter Witkin: Enfer ou ciel" (Hell or Heaven) at the Bibliothèque Nationale de France, "Ai Wei Wei : Entrelacs" at the Jeu de Paume, "Resisting the Present, Mexico 2000/2012" at the Musée d'Art Moderne de la Ville de Paris. These come in addition to the specialized fairs taking place at the same time, in particular the Salon du Dessin 2012 and Drawing Now.

A master of collage and of figurative narration, **Erró** presents collages and paintings that question our political and social environment in a provocative cartoon style. Rafael Barrios' sculptures are not only abstract, they also question our relationship with space and what actually constitutes the space around us. The spectator becomes an actor and his movement is part of the piece. His kinetic works question our perception and the observer realizes that it is his own vision that produces the change of effects.

Georg Küttinger was trained as an architect. In his photographs entitled *"landscape remixed"*, he re-organises space and compresses the horizon. Each of his images is a compression of hundreds of photographs taken in the same location from different angles.

The gallery presents an exhibition entitled *"Anim' OH!"* is a reference to the fact that animals have always been the object of fascination for mankind. Animals have been represented as Gods or on the contrary have been demystified, or quite simply used to support a narrative. The subjects of first paintings made my man with pigments on the walls caves were animals. Several exhibitions and cultural events centering on animals are taking place in Paris this year, including *"Beauté, Animal de de Dürer à Jeff Koons"* from 21st March to 16th July at the Grand Palais. This is partly why the gallery has decided to show the work of two French artists: painter **Vincent Corpet** and sculptor **Quentin Garel**. Vincent Corpet's paintings often refer to animals borrowed directly or indirectly from works by great contemporary or old masters. The sculptures of Quentin Garel are directly concerned with the animal world, with sculptures made of bronze and wood. A 3 metre-high skull of a walrus stands next to a group of ostriches and the mask of an Orang Outang.

In this vein, Australian born **John Young** who has shown at the Guggenheim in New York reflects a nostalgic European view of China in his piece *Ocean's Edge III & IV*. Chinese artists **Shao Yinong** and **Muchen** worked for seven years on embroidering a piece of black silk with money that is no longer in circulation as a commentary on the diversity of political regimes. Meanwhile, **Lindy Lee's** bronze sculptures are inspired by Zen Buddhism.

Wang Keping presents a new series in metal called *"Eternal Smile"* in which old Chinese coins are incorporated into pieces of wood. Finally young talent **Pan Jian** paints landscapes that are replete with emotion and personal stories

For its first time at the fair, the gallery has chosen to present duos of photographers and painters. Two landscape artists are coupled: British photographer **Michael Kenna** and Chinese painter **Jiang Zhi Xin**, both of whom are rightly considered masters of the landscape in their respective countries. Danish artist **Nina Sten Knudsen** who works with light to make lyrical paintings is paired with **Tom Wood** who has been dubbed by his friend Martin Parr as an “*unknown genius of British photography*”. The gallery is also showing a bronze sculpture called “*L’Attrape Nuit*” by **Frédérique Edy** and a delicate portrait of a child entitled “*Liel close up*” painted by **Daniel Enkaoua**.

The theme chosen by ALBERT BAUMGARTEN is urbanisation and architecture. It presents the work of six artists: German painter **Ralph Fleck** works on development and architectural dynamics. He is interested in mega cities and buildings like Brazilian architect Oscar Niemeyer’s Edificio Copan in Sao Paulo, or the gigantic urban planning project by **Jean Dubuisson** in Paris’ Montparnasse area. Meanwhile, Jean Schüler “*kills*” the idea of the country landscape as being an idyllic place. He also produces scenes of daily urban life devoid of personal emotions. Swiss painter **Johannes Hüppi** represents the usual touristic picture postcard images of the Swiss Alps but the presence of naked girls in the middle of the lakes produces a perturbing twist. Japanese photographer **Masao Yamamoto** has his own version of the broken idyllic landscape. He avoids urban glamour and works on nature.

The acrylic objects made by **Régine Schumann** play with transparency and light and are a kind of architecture made of lights and fluorescence. She uses ultraviolet light to make objects that shine like a city at night.

Finally photographer **Dirk Brömmel** makes thematic series like the one of boats seen from above from his Chinese series entitled “*Kaiser-channel*”, or the one on architecture called “*Villa Tugendhat*”. Here he blends the atmosphere of the private life of the Tugendhat family with ideas that revolutionized architecture like the Bauhaus movement.

Established in 2008, the gallery promotes young radical artists from Europe. On show are works by **Rémy Hysbergue** and **Päivi Takala** who approach the question of contemporary painting with concepts that are radically different. With profoundly innovative graphic work, recent offerings by **Zenita Komad** create a bridge between painting and conceptual art. Finally a previously unseen work by **Yann Toma** will be unveiled at the fair. For the past 20 years, the artist has been working on his abstract artistic expression which blends humour, politics and social activism through his space *"Ouest Lumière"*.

Established in 2008, °CLAIR GALERIE specialises in photography. From there, many other forms of artistic expression can also arise. The works of **Rabi Georges**, a German sculptor of Syrian origin seem to hover between life and death. Facing them are the photographs taken by America's **Hally Pancer** that capture the moment of silence before movement and speech.

Polish artist **Adam Adach** paints very realistic pictures of scenes from daily life, while "*Cible*" (target) by **Nicolas Chardon** suggests there may be another use for history. With his falsely naïve alphabet made of distended black squares, he makes grids and funky looking targets. Meanwhile, **Alan Charlton**, Britain's foremost minimal artist, makes monochrome paintings that are all different shades of grey. At the other end of the spectrum is **Mathieu Cherkit** who breathes new life into our daily existence with his flamboyant colours. Mali's historic photographer, **Adama Kouyaté** focusses more on the shadows of his subjects than the subjects themselves.

There is also the strangely jubilant humour of painter **David Scher** from New York; "*Europe*" by **Daniel Schlier** a painter of icons who manages to infuse his work with magical, petrifying power, and finally a monochrome work by **Günter Umberg**, a scion of German abstraction.

The *"in between"* is all about ambiguity: what do these attitudes mean, stuck immobile in moments that seem suspended in time? Is this seemingly ordinary gesture in fact so commonplace? Is this banal normality strange because of the way we look at it, in all its weirdness? Does a seemingly peaceful, anecdotal scene become bizarre or threatening because of the incongruous presence of an out-of-place object? In the end, the viewer hovers between *"the real and the likely"*. This sense of hovering is achieved through high technical mastery which actually makes this troubling silence visible.

Second is *"Blank"*, the latest work by **Luca Gilli**, which belongs to another world entirely. He photographs places that are uninhabited and under construction. The only presence is that of objects. It is hard to know whether these places are real or not: the notion of space and time no longer exists. The places he photographs look like they have been staged. The objects end up looking incongruous in the white, transparent spaces. These non-places have a certain purity to them. Here we hover between reality and poetry.

His series *"August 11th 1999 (30)"* is on the total eclipse of the sun that took place on that date as it was seen simultaneously in Paris, New York, Taipei, Saint-Nazaire, in the middle of a wheat field in Ukraine...

Mexican and American influences are evident in *"Founded Fortune"* by American artist **Scoli Acosta**, a piece comprised of small hands made of bronze and... hand painted.

In *"Blue Triptych"* **Vincent Beaurin** creates shapes of colour made at different times of the day: as a storm approaches, when the earth seems to rise to meet the sky, when dark clouds gather and when patches of blue sky re-appear behind them at the end of the day.

Dark grey is the dominant colour in the sculpture by Belgium's **Peter Buggenhout**. The piece is a mass of trash covered in a thick layer of dust. The title *"The Blind Leading the Blind"* is a reference to a painting by Bruegel and a reminder that the artist is not entirely in control of the final shape his work will take. A monumental piece from this series will be exhibited at the Palais de Tokyo in Paris in April.

Also on show is a piece by **Wang Du** made of bronze thickly coated in nickel. It represents a giant page from the China Daily newspaper. The page is crumpled, its content obsolete and forgotten.

The gallery also presents a painting by **Gérard Traquandi** made in 2011 called *"Brousailles Allens"* in which rays of light struggle to make their way through a dense thicket of vegetation. Meanwhile, **Aleksandra Mir** uses a black marker to create her own universe.

The landscape is both the subject and the object, the container and the content. The viewer is invited to take his time like with his work entitled "*Tempête à Giverny*" made in 2011. Born in Mexico and living in London, **Alicia Paz** works on the notion of discolation, hybridity and metamorphosis. Her canvasses combine historical reference and elements from cartoons and advertising. Finally, recent work by Belgium's **Narcisse Tordoir**, often in large format, combine drawing, photography and painting to make images about the theatre of life and death.

The photographs **Tali Amitai-Tabib**, **Jean-Pierre Attal** and **Alex Plademunt** also compose a particular vision of the world. The work of the catalan Alex Plademunt has become sharper from one series to the next and his view of our convulsed era is increasingly critical and unforgiving. He shares his commitment to political causes with Jean-Pierre Attal who is also sensitive and indignant at what is going on around him. He has plunged fully into the digital revolution and produces work that attempts to capture the imbalances inherent in the "macro" and the "micro" aspects of daily life. As similar form of mysticism and faith inhabits the work of Israeli artist Tali Amitai-Tabib who composes her photographs like odes to wisdom.
